WALT'S SUMMER RACE SCHEDULE : 1989

In addition to the rules below our racing rules will be referenced to ROAR [Radio Operated Auto Racing, PO Box 7308 , Athens, Ga. 30604..404-543-8908] rules...the most important of which apply to motors, batteries and weights [1/2 scale 4 cell is 28 oz., 1/10 scale 2WD is 3.25 lb. and 1/10th scale 4WD is 3.50 lb.] of the cars. You will find that there are a wide variety of stock motors available and most specify that they are ROAR legal [27 turns of 22 AWG wire]; most commonly available battery packs are ROAR legal. If you have a specific question on a motor etc., we'll be glad to assist you. We endeavor to keep are rules as simple as possible and make racing fair for all. We divide types of racing up by skill classifications ie. novice, advanced etc. This is done to encourage the new racers while providing competitive racing for all. While novice class is meant for the new driver, it is expected that the person has a certain amount of driving skill; erratic driving which results in damage to his car and to the other drivers' cars is not acceptable. All normal track rules apply. Transmitter impound will be used.

We will be holding competitive racing seasons on Monday and Tuesday evenings: Sign ups end at 6:30 PM and races begin at 7:00 PM. Each season has twelve scheduled race nights with three drops. Each evening the racer will compete in two heats per class and accumulate points [points will consist of the place the racer finished in the heat plus the number of laps completed]. Since there are 3 drops the sum of the racers'best 9 evenings will determine his standing in the season for which trophies will be awarded. There are two separate seasons one for Mondays and one for Tuesdays; you may compete in either or both. Racing fees will be \$ 4.00 per class per evening; \$ 2.00 per each additional class per evening. For "track members" the fee will be \$ 2.00 per class per evening and \$ 1.00 for each additional class. You may enter the same car (chassis) in a maximum of two classes per evening; since there are 2 minutes between heats, you must be prepared.

## MONDAY EVENING CLASSES AND DATES CLAY OVAL

1/10th Offroad: 2WD Stock: Novice, Advanced, Expert, "J" Novice & "J" Expert [This class is for certain foreign made cars which although quick do not have the set up capabilities of more sophisticated cars like the RC 10: it allows competitive racing with others; these cars however are not restricted to "J" class. "J" class is stock only]. 4 minute heats. Dirt modified bodies are required for Advanced and Expert classes.

1/10th Offroad: 2WD Modified & 4WD Modified [Drivers should possess expert class skills to race this class] 4 minute heats.

Race dates: June 26: July 10, 17, 24 & 31: Aug. 7, 14, 21 & 28: Sept. 11, 18 & 25.

## TUESDAY : CLASSES & DATES CARPET DVAL

1/12th Stock: Novice & Expert: 4 cell. 8 minute heats.

1/12 Modified: 4 cell [Drivers should possess expert class driving skills]

8 minute heats.

1/10th Carpet: Novice & Expert. 4 minute heats. Grand National bodies required.

1/10th Carpet Modified [Drivers should possess expert class driving skills]

4 minute heats.

1/10th Offroad : Novice & Expert [Cars must have gearbox and suspension]
4 minute heats.

Race dates: June 27; July 11, 18 & 25, Aug. 1, 8, 15, 22 & 29; Sept. 12, 19, & 29.
